It is essential for every child to be at school, every day to ensure they learn, grow and flourish. We have fabulous attendance overall and have worked hard post-covid to reengage students and build their sense of connection.

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Home Support

We work the students hard at school to challenge their ideas and expand their knowledge and skills. To support this work, it is important for students to practice these skills at home. Reading with your child every day for 10 minutes will make a significant difference in their ability to progress quickly and with confidence. Mathematics is easily practiced through everyday discussions about the weather (wind direction, rain percentage and time by looking at graphs), cooking (measurement, reading and following instructions), shopping (money and counting) and playing board games (reasoning, problem solving, counting and so much more).

I have no doubt every child loves special 'parent time' and these little moments daily form deep connections that will assist with the more challenging teenage years
