This includes our incredible, feral, Christmas present who we appropriately named 'Holly'



She was rescued from under the family's new house, with her twin, both completely feral. Despite intense training to become a house cat, she still kept some of those traits until the day she left. She was a survivor. We managed to successfully train her out of catching birds, and would even sleep beneath the bushes they were in. Only rarely did she forget and bring us a bird. She was reminded that it wasn't worth it. However, rats and mice were regularly brought in huge numbers, headless to the back door for our approval. On two occasions she actually brought headless snakes. Our approval wasn't as enthusiastic. Visiting dogs were not welcomed in either and she firmly removed them through the front gate.

As a survivor of extraordinary cunning, a favourite game was to hide inside under furniture in the house. Being black it was difficult to find her and one day she got accidentally locked inside. On returning from work at the end of the day we found her very ill in the kitchen floor. Quick examination revealed that she has helped herself to 2 kilo of a roast beef thawing out in the sink for our dinner. She didn't eat for several days...and we had no roast!

I miss her breakfast call at the back door, and peace reigns in the yard for my dog.

Pensioner rates rebate

Are you eligible for a rebate or concession on your rates bill?

If you have a current Centrelink or Department of Veterans' Affairs (DVA) Pensioner Concession Card, or a DVA Repatriation Health Card specifying 'War Widow' or 'TPI', you may be eligible for a concession.

The rate rebate available is 50% of rates and charges capped at a maximum of \$253.20 for 2023-2024.

A maximum \$50 rebate also applies to the Fire Services Property Levy.

Rebates are funded by the State Government and you can find out more at services.dffh.vic.gov.au/municipal-ratesconcession

You can download an application form there or collect one from the Civic Centre in Camperdown.

Local pools ready to open this week

Corangamite Shire's outdoor pools are ready to open their gates for the 2023-2024 season.

Camperdown, Cobden and Terang pools will open Saturday 25 November. Lismore, Skipton and Timboon will follow on Saturday 2 December.

Council Sport and Recreation Coordinator Jane Hinds said the pools were the place to be regardless of the weather.

"All of our pools are solar heated and generally operate between 25 and 28 degrees.

"So if the weather is cooler in the mornings, your local pool is still a great place to go for health and fitness and socialise with friends.

"There is a hotter than average summer predicted so when summer arrives the pool is the ideal spot to escape the heat. It really is the best of both worlds."

Council's Facilities and Recreation and Parks and Gardens Teams have been instrumental in preparing the six outdoor swimming pools in readiness for the 2023-2024 season.

This includes cleaning and preparing pools, maintaining gardens and general maintenance works including:

- Fibreglass repair and repaint on toddler pool water features at Cobden and Skipton.
- Installation of pulsar units at Timboon, Camperdown and Cobden
- Replacement of a flood light at Timboon and a power pole at Cobden and
- Pressure washing of the concourse and refreshing of tables and chairs at Terang.
- · Maintenance of filters at Lismore

Council Sport and Recreation Coordinator Jane Hinds said the pools were in great shape leading up to the season's opening.

"There is lots in store this season—pool parties, movie nights, inflatables and games, as well as early morning lap swimming and, learn to swim programs.

"On warm nights, open hours may be extended at the discretion of the pool manager," Ms Hinds said.

She said Council had worked closely with YMCA Victoria and swimming pool committees over winter to ensure a strong start to the season.

"The swimming pools continue to provide a range of health and wellbeing outcomes for residents.



"The pools are great fun for kids and also have relaxation and mental health benefits for people of all ages."

Mayor Ruth Gstrein encouraged residents to support their local pool and take advantage of the fantastic facilities.

"Love your local pools. They are such valuable community assets and continue to be great value for money.

"They are a terrific opportunity to get the family outdoors and off devices over the summer holidays," she said.

Season tickets are \$185 per family, \$95 per adult and \$85 per child and can be used at all of the Shire's six pools.

Day tickets are \$15.50 per family, \$5.20 per adult and \$4.20 for a child.

Season passes are available from the Civic Centre in Camperdown or can be bought at the pools. EFTPOS facilities are available at each pool.

Council collects phones for violence survivors

Your unwanted mobile phone could provide a vital lifeline for someone in crisis.

Corangamite Shire Council is seeking donations of unused mobile phones that will be refurbished and distributed through family violence centres and police services.

Mayor Kate Makin said registered charity DV Safe Phone collects, erases and repairs phones then provides them to front line family violence and Police services to support victim survivors of domestic violence.

"DV Safe Phone works with more than 250 domestic violence and law enforcement agencies, safe houses and hospitals across the country," Cr Makin said.



"We are launching this campaign as part of the international 16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence campaign from 25 November, the International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women, until Human Rights Day on 10 December.

"Family violence is the leading cause of homelessness for women and children.

"In 2018-19, 90% of adults seeking homelessness services due to family and domestic violence were women.

"These free phones can give those in a volatile situation a safe and private way to reach out for support."

Corangamite Shire is now an Authorised Phone Drop Location where members of the community can drop off unwanted working mobile phones so they can be repurposed and used by someone in need.

Cr Nick Cole said domestic violence affects all walks of life.

"These phones will be distributed to victim survivors of domestic violence, through various frontline organisations and service providers.

"Council believes this is really important work and we are enthusiastic about partnering with DV Safe Phones to provide a location for Phone Drops.

"Council is supporting the cause by locating collection boxes at the Civic Centre with our libraries in Camperdown, Cobden, Derrinallum, Terang and Timboon to come online next month.

"This is an opportunity to make a real difference in the lives of those currently experiencing family and domestic violence.

"We encourage anyone with a spare phone, or two, they no longer use, to drop them in the nearest collection box."

DV Safe Phone founder and CEO Ashton Wood said the phones are provided as part of an individual's 'safety plan' offering a lifeline to call for help when it is needed most.

"A mobile phone is something that many of us take for granted, but it can be a potential lifesaver for victim survivors of domestic and family violence, giving them a direct line to emergency responders and support services," Mr Wood said.

Corangamite Shire is committed to working with local and statewide services to reduce family violence and its impacts on communities.
