#### Recipe of the Month

#### MADEIRA CAKE

170g softened butter 3/4 cup caster sugar 1 tsp vanilla extract 3 eggs 1 cup plain flour3/4 tsp baking powder2/3 cup almond meal

- 1. Preheat oven to 170 degrees (150 FF).
- 2. Place butter, sugar and vanilla in the bowl of an electric mixer; beat until light and creamy.
- 3. Gradually, add the eggs, beating well after each addition. Sift flour and baking powder over the butter mixture, and gently fold through with the almond meal.
- 4. Spoon the mixture into a lightly greased 22cm x 8cm loaf tin, lined with non-stick baking paper, and bake for 50 minutes, or until cooked when tested with a skewer.
- 5. Cool in tin for 5 minutes before turning out onto a wire rack to cool completely.

Ed's note: Some of you may remember a very old Flanders and Swann song, "Have Some Madeira, M'dear"!

I've often wondered why this cake is called Madeira, when there is not a drop in the mixture. Perhaps it was eaten with a small glass of that fortified wine?



#### Art on Kennas Lane


Local artist, Jess Fowler, has opened her studio/gallery on Kennas Lane, Glenormiston South.



#### Rates and charges due 15 **February**

Corangamite Shire ratepayers are reminded that the 2023-2024 Rates and Charges are due for full payment by Thursday 15 February. If paying by instalments, the third payment is due by Wednesday 28 February.

Payments can be made at corangamite.vic. gov.au/payments, by BPAY (phone or Internet), by POSTbillpay (phone or Internet), in person at any Australia Post agency or at Council's Civic Centre, 181 Manifold Street, Camperdown or by post to Corangamite Shire, PO Box 84, Camperdown 3260.

Any ratepayer unable to pay by the due date should contact the Rates office. You can also apply for a Payment Arrangement at corangamite-pay.enotices.com.au

#### Pensioner rates rebate

If you have a current Centrelink or Department of Veterans' Affairs (DVA) Pensioner Concession Card, or a DVA Repatriation Health Card specifying 'War Widow' or 'TPI', you may be eligible for a concession.

The rate rebate available is 50% of rates and charges capped at a maximum of \$253.20 for 2023-2024. A maximum \$50 rebate also applies to the Fire Services Property Levy.

Rebates are funded by the State Government and you can find out more at services.dffh.vic. gov.au/municipal-rates-concession


