Recipe of the Month

SWEET CORN SALAD WITH SPICY DRESSING

4 corn cobs, silks removed

2 tablespoons olive oil

¼ cantaloupe, peeled and thinly sliced

1 Lebanese cucumber, chopped

250g cherry tomatoes, halved

½ bunch coriander, leaves picked

½ bunch mint, leaves picked

3 spring onions, thinly sliced

Spicy Dressing

Juice of 2 limes
Juice of ½ an orange

2 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil

1 tablespoon brown sugar

½ teaspoon smoked paprika



- 1. For the dressing, whisk all ingredients together. Set aside.
- 2. Heat a BBQ or chargrill pan to high heat. Brush corn with oil and grill, turning occasionally for 10 minutes, until charred.
- 3. Once cool, slice kernels from cobs.
- 4. Place on a serving plate with remaining ingredients, and drizzle with dressing.

MOUNT NOORAT SCHOOL

No. II78

1873 - 2023

I5O YEARS

The Mount Noorat School opened on November 10, 1873, consisting of the small stone building, which is still part of the present Noorat Primary School.

In 1868, a few residents of Mount Noorat began to agitate for a school when Murdoch Macdonald of *Horseshoe Bend*, Noorat and David Ellis of *Allambah* wrote letters to the Board of Education. At that time the following families, irrespective of their religious faiths, had potential children for the school: Adcock, Patrick Brennan & Nicholas Brennan, Beechey, Carson, Clynes, Ellis, Goodwin, Macrae, Murdoch Macdonald & Simon Macdonald and Scally. At the time, the Board of Education did not consider that there were enough children to warrant building a school at Mount Noorat.

By July 1872, the residents of Mount Noorat had donated £38 towards a school building with three people appointed to canvas the district.

On November 27, 1872, The Board of Education finally approved a grant and in December 1872 a tender was accepted from Mr James Taylor, a builder of Terang along with architect Henry R. Bastow, to erect the stone building on two acres of gazetted land. The building was complete on June 6, 1873.

The Mount Noorat School opened on November 10, 1873 with Mrs Margaret Evans as Head Teacher. Mrs Evans, a widow with five children, was forced to board at the Mount Noorat Hotel until the teacher's residence was completed in April 1874.

In early December 1873, the home of Mrs Carson become a Presbyterian Church for Mount Noorat with an official church building opening in 1974.





Free green waste disposal to get your home bushfire-ready

Two weather systems – El Niño and a positive Indian Ocean Dipole – will mean hotter and drier conditions over spring and summer, leading to a higher fire risk.

In addition, recent wet conditions have increased grass growth, so there is a higher risk of grassfires coming into summer.

Council is offering free domestic green waste disposal to Shire residents until Sunday 5 November to help you get ready for fire season.

In addition, green-lidded Food Organics and Garden Organics bins are being collected weekly, instead of fortnightly, until the end of the year.

Non-commercial customers can drop off green waste at the Naroghid Landfill and all Shire transfer stations.

Normally a heaped trailer or ute load of green waste costs \$38.80 to dispose of, so this is a great chance to clean up your property for free.

Council officers are carrying out inspections this month and will issue fire prevention notices to properties that need to reduce vegetation.

Seven steps to safety

To safeguard yourself and your neighbours:


- Tidy up around your yard, especially in gutters and around your house.
- If you have one, clear your firebreak. It is still possible for grass to grow in gravel.
- Move firewood away from your home.
- · Cut your grass.
- Create and discuss a Bushfire Plan with your family.
- Always have a secondary plan in case something goes wrong.
- Plan for pets and livestock as well as your family.

All residents should have a fire plan and know what to do if there is a fire. Now is the best time to understand your fire risk and get prepared, not when a fire starts.
